Chairman of the Senate Un-American Activities Committee, appointed me as one of the five members to this important function. ## Gun Owners Betrayed by Assemblywoman Wolk

Recently, Assemblywoman Lois Wolk (D-Davis), the former Vice Chair of the Legislature Outdoor Sporting Caucus, voted for and spoke in strong support of AB 2062, the ammunition registration bill, on the floor of the Assembly. Later on, when given the opportunity to vote against a bill that furthers the cause of communism in California, Wolk chose to abstain, but only after voting against amendments offered by Republicans to thwart the measure. She chose to walk the tightrope making it appear that she was against it when in reality she did nothing to defeat the measure.

The radical Democrat leadership in the Capitol knows that Wolk is in a very tight race for a Senate seat against ardent pro-gunner Assemblyman Greg Aghazarian (R-Stockton), in a district that has been won by the Democrats by very close margins over the past 8 years. After the leadership got the votes they needed from Wolk, they then gave her a pass when it was clear they had the votes to pass the bill supporting communism.

Because of the nature of the 5th Senate District, which includes portions of Sacramento, San Joaquin, Solano and Yolo counties, Wolk has tried to pass herself off as a supporter of the outdoor sportsman but her real record shows something different.

The Legislative Outdoor Sporting Caucus was established "as a bi-partisan group from both houses of the legislature, with a caucus goal to protect and enhance California's wildlife habitats, and to further the understanding and acceptance of outdoor activities throughout the state. The caucus is also an important tool to support the interests of California's many outdoor enthusiasts, as well as provide a bi-partisan voice for outdoor sporting issues within the State Legislature," according to their website.

Wolk has proven to be the antithesis of this and maybe that is why she dropped out of her leadership role. Everyone could see

through the charade.

By voting for AB 2062, Wolk showed that she really didn't care for the honest law-abiding gun owner, hunter or sportsman, but in fact, went along with heaping more restrictions and regulations on them that have proven to be ineffective at reducing crime. The good news is that we were able defeat AB 2062 in the Senate. The bad news is that SB 1322 supporting communism has been sent to the Governor's desk for his consideration.

That is why GOC is making the race for the 5th Senate seat one of its top priorities. No question about it, Assemblyman Greg Aghazarian with his life-time pro-gun voting record is the right choice for this seat and with Assemblywoman Lois Wolk's anti-gun voting record the choice is easy.

# The Second Amendment Ruled An Individual Right!

The U.S. Supreme Court's June 26, 2008, D.C. v. Heller opinion marked a historic day for American gun rights, striking down the D.C. handgun ban and trigger-lock requirement and, in dissenting Justice Stephen Breyer's words, threatening "to throw into doubt the constitutionality of gun laws throughout the United States." Visibly upset, Dianne Feinstein said Heller left her "profoundly disappointed."

The High Court followed our (GOA/GOC's) urging, rejecting any balancing of governmental powers against individual liberties. It ruled the ban is prohibited by plain Second Amendment language that elevates above all other interests the "right of lawabiding, responsible citizens to use arms in

defense of hearth and home."

The Court did say its opinion should "not be taken to cast doubt" on some prohibited persons' restrictions, "gun free" school zones, and dealer licensing requirements. This dicta implies that future courts might try to uphold some unconstitutional gun restrictions. Still, the Court's opinion flatly denies what anti-rights advocates (i.e., the Brady Campaign) have said for years. So we welcome this opportunity to fight for the people's right to keep and bear arms.

Gun Owners is preparing constitutional challenges to a range of federal, state, and local laws that violate the Second Amendment as endorsed in Heller.

And ... we are confident that many California laws now on the books conflict with the decision, and so are subject to challenge, including the ban on so-called "assault weapons", the "safe handgun" law (permitting California sales of only politically correct handguns), and several others.

# Legislative Report

### Lethal Bills Die in the Senate....

AB 2062 (DeLeon -D) commonly known as the "Ammo Registration" bill, and AB 2235 (DeSaulnier -D), known as the "Smart Gun" bill, were left in the suspense file in the Senate Appropriations Committee. AB 2948 (Leno-D) would have banned the sale of ammunition and firearms at the state owned Cow Palace exposition facility near San Francisco, but, the bill was defeated on the Senate Floor.

GOC Lobbyist and Executive Director, Sam Paredes, said, "These bills are effectively dead." This was the good news after spending so much of the year at the Capitol working against their passage. This is an exciting victory for gun owners throughout the state.

### Legislative Action Alert!

AB 2498 (Saldana-D) Firearms training: eligibility to possess firearms – Would require that anyone desiring to take a firearms training class must first obtain a background check.

Currently, the Department of Justice fees and other associated costs for such a check total approximately \$69 to \$89. The bill was originally aimed at businesses that train personnel under a federal contract who, according to the author's office, are instructed on how to "hurt people." But, the bill has now been expanded to include anyone who takes any training of any kind, even a basic safety course for new owners of firearms!

The added cost and red tape this bill would impose on prospective trainees may stop most from seeking to take even the basic courses!

The author has also been talking about expanding the proposed legislation's coverage to include background checks for purchasers of rifle scopes!! She believes that scopes, even those for hunting, are "tactical" equipment that can also be used to "hurt people."

This bill has been sent to the Governor's desk and awaits his action. Call the Governor's office and ask him to VETO AB 2498.

SB 1171 (Scott - D) Firearms: Open Carry in unincorporated areas - At the same time that the National Park Service and the U.S. Fish and Wildlife Service are planning to loosen up firearm regulations in their neck of the woods, California state Senator Jack Scott is seeking ways to tighten up and further constrict gun owners in the unincorporated areas of the state. National Parks and Wildlife Refuges have been places where carrying openly while loaded was banned. Obviously, self defense issues arise out of such laws. California has allowed loaded open carry in unincorporated areas, which includes remote areas, until now. SB 1171 will prevent carrying a loaded gun in a car or truck while on a public highway or road in California's unincorporated areas. This incremental step will most likely be

Unincorporated areas of California should continue to be free for carrying a loaded firearm by a lawabiding citizen in the interest of self preservation and family protection. If the National Services can see the reasonableness of loosing their restrictions, why can't Senator Scott?

# California Threatened by Communism
